Translating Closed Captions.

Here's how to translate captions into your preferred language in the YouTube Player using a tablet. This tutorial was created for an iPad, but the steps are similar for other tablets.

Step 1. Tap the closed captions button. On a tablet, this button is located on the upper right. It looks like a black box outlined in white, with the letters CC written in white inside.

When you tap it, a message will temporarily appear in the lower left to confirm your choice, and the captions will automatically appear in English. The button will also change from black with white letters to white with black letters.

Step 2. Tap the settings button. This button is also located on the upper right, next to the captions button. It looks like a cog, which is a circle with ridges around the outside. This button is also black with a white edge.

Step 3. Tap where it says captions, English, auto-generated in the menu that appears. This will open the captions options menu.

Step 4. Notice that English is selected. Tap on the option below it that says Auto-Translate. This will open a list of all the languages the YouTube player can translate into other languages.

Note, there are fewer language options when using a tablet than there are when using a computer. If the language you're looking for isn't on the list that appears, you might consider translating the captions on a computer instead.

Step 5. Tap on the language you want to use. A confirmation message will temporarily appear in the lower left, and the captions will change to the language you selected.

The captions will stay in the language you chose while you're watching the current video, but you'll need to repeat these steps when you watch other ones.

Step 6. To change back to English, tap the captions button again, and select that option in the menu that appears.

Step 7. To turn captions off, tap the captions button again, and select that option in the menu that appears.
