


2024 Leadership Series Application

Depending on your email settings, you may also notice that some of the messages you receive about your application will say they came from "The AinA Leadership Series via questionpro.com".


Rest assured that neither of these things is a computer glitch. The application you're about to complete, and the messages you may receive about it, are from our team here at Advocates in Action.


How to Complete this Form

The form has 20 questions, each of which should be answered by YOU, the person applying. Questions that are required will have an asterisk (*) and be highlighted in red. You need to answer all of the required questions, or you won't be able to submit your application.

If you're unsure how to answer a question, that's ok! Give it your best shot, and let us know if you need help in your response.

For example, if you don't understand a question, write, "I don't understand," and continue to the next question. This will allow you to complete your application and remind us to talk about that question during your interview.


We placed each of the questions in this application on a separate page. Here's how to navigate through the form:



- **CLICK the BACK ARROW** (<) to return to the previous question.
- CLICK the word NEXT to go forward.
- CLICK "Save & Continue Later" to take a break and return later to finish.

If you decide to **Save & Continue Later**, a pop-up window like the one below will appear and remind you to finish answering the current question first.

As you may notice, the program we use to process our applications calls the form you're working on a "survey". Don't let that name confuse you. They're the same thing!



If you want to make any changes to your answer, click **Cancel**. If everything looks OK, and you're ready to save your application, click **Continue** and enter your email in the window that appears.

We'll send you a personalized link at this address so you can finish your application when you're ready. Please check your email and keep this message in a safe place.

If you're using someone else's address, check with them. If you lose your personalized link, you'll need to restart the application from the beginning.

Note: If you're working on a saved application, you must complete it before the deadline on **Friday, January 19th!**



You're welcome to complete the form on your own or ask someone you trust to assist you. You can also contact Advocates in Action using the information below. We'll be happy to walk you through the application process and answer any questions you may have.

Once you've answered all of the questions, click the green button that appears at the end of the form to submit your application.





Our team here at Advocates in Action will review your application and send you a copy of your completed form, along with instructions for scheduling your interview. Everyone who applies for next year's class, including support staff, must attend an interview.



Interviews last approximately 20 minutes and will take place virtually using the Zoom Video App. The schedule is listed below:

Relax and Take Your Time



This is **NOT A TEST**

If you prefer a specific time on one of these days, we recommend scheduling your interview as soon as possible to reserve the slot before another applicant claims it. If you plan to take the class with a support person, we recommend coordinating with them before scheduling so you can interview together.

Remember, this isn't a test! These questions are about you. The only way to get something wrong is by skipping it. Relax, answer things to the best of your ability, and take your time.

We created the Leadership Series to empower individuals who have an Intellectual/Developmental Disability, or "I/DD", with some of the skills people need to make informed decisions, take charge of their lives, speak up for themselves, and support others to do the same.

There's no cost to participate, but you must meet the following requirements to join the Leadership Series. If your answer indicates that you don't meet these requirements, you'll be redirected to a page where you can learn about some of the other activities we offer.

If you think you made a mistake, you're also welcome to restart the application from the beginning and correct your answers.

Requirement 1: Do you have an Intellectual/Developmental Disability?

This question is required.

To be eligible for the Leadership Series, you must have an Intellectual/ Developmental Disability. This is important because it means you have "lived experience" to share!

If you need to bring a support person to help you participate in class, that individual is also eligible, but must complete a separate application and attend an interview before we can accept them.

Select the answer that best describes how you meet this requirement from the 3 options listed below:

- Option 1: YES. I have an Intellectual/Developmental Disability (I/DD).
- Option 2: NO. I don't have an I/DD, but I'll be providing support to a fellow class member who does.

Write the name of the person who you will be supporting and describe how they're related to you. For example, are they a family member, friend, or paid support person. If you're not sure who this person will be yet, write that instead.

Option 3: NO. Neither of the options above apply.

Requirement 2: Are you a Rhode Island resident?

This question is required.

The Leadership Series is open to Rhode Island residents, and those who live out of state, but will be providing support to a fellow class member who resides here.

Select the answer that describes your residency status from the following 3 options:

If you select option 2, a dialogue box will open so you can enter the state where you're a resident.

- Option 1: YES. I am a RI resident
- Option 2: No, I am not a RI resident, but I will be supporting a fellow class member who is.

 If you aren't a Rhode Island resident, where are you a resident?
- Option 3: NO. I am not a RI resident.

Requirement 3: Are you age 18 or older? If not, will you be turning 18 in 2024?

This question is required.

You must be at least 18 years old, which is the legal Voting age in Rhode Island, or celebrate your 18th birthday in 2024, to be eligible for the Leadership Series.

Select your answer from one of the 3 options listed below.

- Option 1: YES. I am of voting age (18 or older).
- Option 2: Not yet. I'm 17 years old, but I'll turn 18 before the end of 2024.

 If you'll be turning 18 in 2024, when is your birthday?
- Option 3: NO. I won't be old enough to vote by the end of 2024.

* NOTE: If you answered "no" to any of the last 3 questions because you don't meet that requirement, you'll be re-directed to this page.



QUESTION 3: What email address will you be using for class?

This question is required.


Applicants need to have a way to send and receive email. We'll be using email throughout our time together to share homework assignments, information about group projects and contests (with real prizes when you win!), extra resources about the topics we cover in class, and invitations to other meetings or events you might be interested in.

We also encourage class members to stay connected with our Leadership Series team by emailing us any questions, comments, or ideas you want to share.

Using email is an important requirement for being in the Leadership Series, but it doesn't mean you need to do it alone. If you don't have an address or use email, you can ask a family member, friend, or one of your paid support staff to use theirs. If you decide to use someone else's email address, you'll be able to enter their name and how they're related to you in the next question.

Remember, if this isn't your address, you'll need to connect with the person who owns it at least once a week to check for messages from our Leadership Series team and send a reply.

Write the email address that you'll be using for class in the space below. Make sure you enter it in the correct format.



For example, if your email is "DonaldDonald@gmail.com", remember to include the three-letter extension (.com) at the end.

This is important because if we don't have your correct address, we won't be able to contact you!

QUESTION 4: Who does the email address you'll be using for class belong to?

This question is required.

You must be able to send and receive email on a regular basis to be in the Leadership Series, but you don't need to own the address you'll be using.

QUESTION 5: What is the best phone number to reach you?

This question is required.

Although we'll be using email as the primary way to connect with class members, we also need a way to reach you by phone. We'll use this number to contact you if we have questions or information to share that's better suited for a phone conversation than an email message.

We prefer calling class members directly, but if talking on the phone isn't your thing, you're welcome to use a number that belongs to another person.

If the number you're using belongs to someone else, remember that you'll need to check with them for messages from our Leadership Team between classes.

QUESTION 6: Who does the phone number you're using belong to?

This question is required.

We need a phone number where we can reach you to share updates and other information, but you're welcome to use someone else's number if necessary.

Select the answer that describes who the phone number you're using for class belongs to from the two options listed below. Note, if you select the second option, a dialogue box will open so you can enter that person's name and how they're related to you.

Section 2: Adding a Contact Person

We'll send any printed materials you may need for class and other correspondence directly to you, the applicant. You're welcome to make copies and share whatever message we send with others who will be supporting you in the Leadership Series.

In addition, we can also send a copy of those messages to your designated contact person. When we do this, it means we'll send messages directly to you and will also include your contact person in our "Cc list" so they get a copy of the same information.

*Adding a Contact Person to our Cc list isn't the same as bringing a Support Person with you to class.

If you add a contact person, we'll email them the same information whenever we send you a message about class. If you need to bring a support person with you to class, you'll be able to add that information in **Section 4**: **Accommodations and Accessibility**.

You're welcome to bring a support person if you think you'll need their assistance during class. Our Leadership team will also be available to help, and the fact that classes will be virtual means you may not need the same assistance as you would if we met in person, such as transportation or help with personal care.

If you do decide to bring a support person, that individual needs to complete a separate application to join the Leadership Series. If we're able to accept you into next year's class, we'll accept your support person, too, which means you don't need to add them as your contact person because they'll already be on our mailing list!

QUESTION 7: Would you like to add a Contact Person?

This question is required.

We can share a copy of class-related information, such as homework projects or changes to the schedule, with your contact person. Whether or not we do so is up to you, and either decision is fine.

QUESTION 9: What type of equipment will you use to participate in the Leadership Series?


This question is required.

If at all possible, we strongly recommend using a computer with the Zoom Desktop App for the best overall experience possible. We don't recommend using a Smartphone to connect, but you're welcome to do so if that's your only option.

Section 4: Accommodations and Accessibility

This section is about any type of accommodations you may need to participate in the class. Although we ask whether or not you feel comfortable reading and writing, remember that you DON'T need the ability to do either of those things to join the Leadership Series!

We make all of our materials available in a variety of formats, such as pictures, videos, music, and games, to make the information accessible, inclusive, and easy to understand for people with a variety of learning styles. We provide free text to speech technology that will read aloud and translate the materials we share in class, homework assignments, and other resources. Finally, we teach the class with a team of Peer Mentors who'll be there to help.

There are no wrong answers to the following 2 questions! Your response, combined with those we receive from other applicants, will help us customize our materials and improve the overall class experience for everyone.

QUESTION 10: Are you comfortable READING?

This question is required.

This question is about whether or not you feel comfortable reading. We realize that people communicate in many different ways, from books to body language and beyond! In this instance, "reading" refers to the printed word, either on paper or screen.

Remember, you DON'T need to read to be part of the Leadership Series. We ask this question because we value your feedback, and your response will help us improve the experience for everyone who joins our next class.

If you're not comfortable reading, it's nothing to be embarrassed about!

Select the response that best describes how comfortable you feel about reading from the following options. Once you've made your selection, a dialogue box will open so you can add comments if you'd like to clarify your choice. For example, you might be comfortable reading alone but not enjoy reading in front of others.

If you don't have any comments make an "X" or type "none".

If you have a different answer to share, select the 4th option and write your response in the box that opens.

QUESTION 11: Are you comfortable WRITING?

This question is required.

Like the previous question, when we say "writing", we're referring to using pen and paper, a computer, or other technology to communicate your thoughts with words.

While you'll need a way to record your answers for some of the homework and other activities, there are lots of different ways you can do that. For example, some people communicate with pictures, music, videos, drawing, and other artwork.

We actually encourage members to be as creative as possible as they work on projects for class. After all, being creative is an excellent quality in leaders. There's no wrong way to record your answers to the work we'll be doing together, so you won't need to write things in the traditional way if you'd prefer to draw, paint, record, or sing about them instead.

The responses we receive to this question will help us make our next class as accessible and inclusive as possible for everyone who joins us.

Please don't feel embarrassed if you're uncomfortable with reading or writing! The majority of previous class members weren't, either, and your answer won't affect your application in any way.

Select the response that best describes how comfortable you feel about writing from the following list. Once you've made your selection, a dialogue box will open so you can add comments or additional information about your response. If you have nothing else to share, make an "X" or type "none".

QUESTION 12: Will anyone be taking the class with you to provide support?

This question is required.

Your support person is welcome to join you in class if you think you'll need their assistance to participate in the Leadership Series.

We require everyone who plans to be present when we meet to complete a separate application and follow the graduation requirements listed in section 5, including support staff.

If we accept your application for the next Leadership Series, we'll accept your support person, too, but they need to complete a separate application form.

Let us know if you'll have someone with you during class by selecting an answer from the 4 options listed below.

QUESTION 13: Do you need any accommodations to participate in the Leadership Series?

This question is required.

We create class materials in multiple formats and strive to make them both accessible and as user-friendly as possible. The Leadership Series also takes place virtually, which means all of the homework assignments, handouts, and other resources we share will be available in digital format. In addition to saving some trees, that means you'll be able to use the *Browse Aloud* screen reader tool available on the Advocates in Action website, along with other accessibility features, to listen to the text, change the font size, and translate information into other languages if needed.

At the same time, we know everyone is unique, especially when it comes to communication styles and accommodations, and will work with you to provide the most appropriate accommodations possible to help you succeed.

Section 5: Graduation Requirements

This section explains what to expect during the Leadership Series and what the requirements are for graduation. We've described some of the time commitments, group projects, and other activities that you'll be involved in as a member of the Leadership Series. We understand this may look like a lot of work, but remember: looks can be deceiving!

While it's true that you'll be busy, we guarantee the Leadership Series is NOT your typical classroom. Chances are the activities we do and the time we spend together will be unlike anything you ever experienced in school.

For example, you don't need to have any special training or technical skills to join us. Don't worry if you've never done some of the things on this list, like attending meetings using the Zoom Video App, researching an important topic on the internet, or giving a Virtual Presentation in front of a large group of people; we'll teach you!

We meet often, so there's no need to rush. You'll have plenty of time to relax, ask questions, get to know your classmates, and be yourself. And we spend time practicing together before doing these activities outside of the classroom. If you don't feel ready, say the word, and we'll practice some more.

You'll also have a Peer Mentor available to provide individual assistance as needed. Peer Mentors are Leadership Series graduates who work for Advocates in Action to support current members. Your Mentor will check in with you between classes to help explain the homework and answer other questions.

And speaking of homework, you should also know that we don't grade your work. That means the only way you can "fail" is by refusing to try. In order to graduate, you need to come to class, give it your best effort, and remember that it's ok to ask for help.

If you're concerned about these requirements, or worried about something else that might prevent you from joining the next class, click the last item on our list, and a dialogue box will open so you can explain your situation and let us know how we can help. We'll review that information when we receive your application so we can also talk about any issues you may have during the interview.

Either way, you can rest assured that our Leadership Series team is flexible, creative, and committed to your success. We know you'll be amazing and pledge to work with you to help figure things out.









QUESTION 14: Do you agree with our Leadership Series Participation and Privacy requirements?

This question is required.

Click the checkbox to let us know you agree with this requirement. ☐ Requirement 2: The Leadership Series is a BIG commitment! Classes meet every Wednesday from February 7th thru the end of June. Members should only miss class if they have an excused absence, or they may not be able to graduate. An "excused absence" means you aren't able to attend class due to circumstances beyond your control. For example, missing class because you're sick or you lose your internet connection are both excused absences. On the other hand, deciding to skip class and go to the beach definitely isn't one! In fact, too many unexcused absences could prevent you from graduating. Click the checkbox to let us know you agree with this requirement. ☐ Requirement 3: As a member of next year's Leadership Series, you'll have various assignments to work on outside of class. You'll also have a team of Peer Mentors that you can contact for assistance. In the Leadership Series, you don't need to worry about failing because we don't assign any grades. But you do need to attempt to do the work, and you're welcome to ask a Peer Mentor for some help. Members must make an effort, even if they're unsure what the "right answer" is. Bring your work to class instead of arriving empty-handed. Section 6: The Rhode Island Developmental Disabilities Service System and You

This section is about your connection to the RI DD System. You don't need to be connected to the DD System to join the Leadership Series. However, you should know in advance that we spend a significant amount of our time together discussing DD Services and Supports, how to navigate the DD system, and what options are available for those who either Self-Direct or use a Provider Agency to manage the Services they receive.

Your answer to the following question will help us customize our curriculum for this year's class.



QUESTION 15: Do you currently receive DD services?

This question is required.

By "DD Services", we mean services and supports that are funded through the RI Division of Developmental Disabilities, such as Residential, Shared Living Arrangements, Supported Employment, and Community Day Supports.

Not every Rhode Islander who has an I/DD uses services that are funded through the Division. If you're someone who does, you can manage these services yourself ("Self-Direct"), go through a licensed Provider Agency, or use a combination of these 2 options.

Indicate whether or not you currently receive services funded through the RI Division of Developmental Disabilities by selecting one of the options listed below. Once you've made your selection, add the additional information requested in the box that opens.

Option 1: YES. I currently receive DD Services.

Describe the type of services you receive and whether you Self-Direct, use a Provider Agency, or a combination of both in the box that opens.

Option 2: NOT YET. I've already applied to the Division of Developmental Disabilities, but I haven't begun to receive services yet. For example, select this option if you're new to the DD System and still in the process of finding a Provider Agency or hiring your own Direct Support Staff.

Option 4: N/A (Not Applicable). I don't have an I/DD, but I'm applying to support a fellow applicant who does.

Section 7: About Being a Leader

Some people refer to this as an "essay question", which can sound pretty scary, but we hope it isn't for you. We're really NOT looking for a lot of big or fancy words here, and we definitely aren't worried about how you shpell them! =)

Please relax and feel free to write as little or as much as you want. Remember, these are your thoughts and ideas, so there's no wrong way to answer.



QUESTION 18: Who are you? Tell us about yourself!


This question is required.

You've almost reached the end of the application! This last section is the place to share any other questions, comments, or concerns you have about joining the Leadership Series.


